Subject: Transfer WIA Dislocated Worker Funds to WIA Adult Funds

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TO: WIA ADULT AND DISLOCATED WORKER CONTRACTORS

PURPOSE

The purpose of this directive is to provide notice that the Los Angeles County Workforce Investment Board (LACWIB) approved the transfer of funds from the Dislocated Worker to the Adult program at the beginning of the program year, based on contractors meeting the 80% expenditure requirement from the previous program year.

BACKGROUND

The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) allows for the transfer of funds between the adult and dislocated worker funding streams in order to maximize customer service and to provide local boards with greater flexibility to respond to changes in their local labor markets.

On June 27, 2011, the Department of Labor (DOL) granted California an extension of the waiver to permit an increase of the funds transfer limitation in WIA Section 133(b)(4). This waiver is granted through June 30, 2012. Under this waiver, local boards may transfer up to 50% of the WIA adult funds and up to 50% of the dislocated worker funds allocated to the local area between the adult and dislocated worker funding streams.


POLICY AND PROCEDURES

Contractors may choose to shift between the DW and Adult Program funding streams, at the earliest, at the beginning of the program year, or on a case by case basis. All requests will be reviewed and approved at the discretion of the Contracts Management Division (CMD). To request a transfer of funds, interested agencies shall contact their CMD contract analyst via an e-mail with a justification for the request.

ACTION

Los Angeles County WIA contractors should ensure that the requirements described herein are communicated throughout the operations, management and governance structure of the contractor organization and that this Directive is appropriately maintained until further notice.
